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THINK ON THESE THINGS

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ADOPTION

To those who receive Christ and believe in His name, God gives the authority to become the children of God. It gives them a position or standing which they did not have by any natural right. Believers have this awesome privilege by the authority of the almighty, eternal and unchangeable God.

It is one of the "things above where Christ is seated at the right hand of God." *Col* 3:1 and also one of the "spiritual blessings in the heavenly places in Christ." *Eph* 1:3. It is as unchangeable, irrevocable, eternal and unshakable as the throne of God.

We become sons of God by faith in Christ Jesus, (Gal 3:26). This is called adoption in Gal 4:5-7 (NKJV) or full rights as sons (NIV). In Rom 8:15 believers are described a having received the Spirit of adoption.

Those who receive Christ and believe in His name have this blessing now as a present possession in heaven. "Beloved, now are we the sons of God" 1 John 3:2 and there will be a full manifestation in the future (Rom 8:23).

The way in which adoption comes about is described in John 1:11,12:

He came unto his own, and his own did not receive him. But as many as received him, to them gave he right to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name.

The gospel was to be preached first of all to the Jews (Rom 1:16) and in accordance with God's purpose He came to His own, the Jewish people. The Jews were expecting an earthly messianic kingdom for the glory of Israel among the nations, and deliverance for Israel from their Roman conquerors. But Jesus showed no interest at all in setting up an earthly kingdom.

Now after that John was put in prison, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, And saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent, and believe the gospel. *Mark* 1:14,15

He preached the kingdom of God. This was a spiritual kingdom, not

of this world, (John 18:36). It was not what they wanted and therefore they did not receive Him.

WHAT IT MEANS TO RECEIVE CHRIST

Human responsibility is fully involved:

"But as many as received Him...." John 1:12

"Whoever will may come." Rev 22:17, John 3:15,16

Receiving Him involves a number of responses involving acts of the will on our part. The first of these is repentance. He came to call sinners to repentance, (Mark 2:17). Just before He ascended to heaven Jesus told His disciples.....

"that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem." *Luke 24:47*

The apostle Paul described the gospel message to both Jews and Gentiles "that they should repent, turn to God, and do works befitting repentance." *Acts* 26:20

When he was imprisoned in Rome many came to Paul and his message to them is summarised as "Testifying both to the Jews, and also to the Greeks, repentance toward God, and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ." *Acts* 20:21

Without faith it is impossible to please God:

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life. *John 3:16*

He who believes on the Son has everlasting life: and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abides on him. *John 3:36*

who has my commandments, and keeps them, he it is that loves me: and he that loves me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him. *John 14:21*

And the grace of our Lord was exceeding abundant with faith and love which is in Christ Jesus. 1 Tim 1:14

For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day 2 *Tim 1:12*

But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right (exousia*) to become children of God, to those who believe in His name. *John 1:12*

*exousia εξουσια, authority or right

(not δυναμι**s** dunamis, doo'-nam-is power, ability)

Authority, is to be distinguished from power (KJV) in the sense of ability.

Adoption is by brought into effect by the authority of God in heaven. "Authority that flows from His throne unto His own."

ADOPTION AND THE NEW BIRTH

We cannot have any one aspect of salvation without all the others. However, there are different aspects of salvation and it helps our understanding to distinguish clearly between them. It is also important for instance, to distinguish between justification and sanctification. Those who do not do so, leave themselves open to the universal error of salvation by works.

The difference between adoption and the new birth may be seen in a number of respects:

- God gives us the authority to be called the children of God, but it is not at all appropriate to think of God giving us authority to be born again, for that is the sovereign prerogative of the Holy Spirit. John 3:8 and John 1:13. (God gives those who have been born again the ability and power to live the new life in Christ, but that is not under consideration here.)
- The new birth takes place <u>within us here on earth</u>, but adoption is brought into effect by the authority of God <u>in</u> heaven.

Adoption takes place as a result of receiving Christ and this involves a number of definite choices. These are acts of the will of man, including repentance, faith, commitment, love and obedience. They are not acts of the will of the flesh, but acts of a will that has been set free from the bondage of fallen human nature by the new birth. John 1:13 states that the new birth is independent of the will of man.

THE WITNESS OF THE SPIRIT

"The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children" *Rom 8:16*

The Holy Spirit bears witness to us of adoption or sonship. It carries with it the awesome privilege of being heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ. Rom 8:15-17, Eph 1:13,14

BEHOLD WHAT MANNER OF LOVE

In 1 John 3:11 believers are called upon to take very careful notice of the greatness and the special kind of love which God has bestowed upon us that we should be called the children of God. The greatness of that love is seen in the fact that God gave His only Son to die on the cross for our sins. He did not spare His own Son. (Rom 8:32, John 3:16, Rom 5:8)

THE SPECIAL KIND OF LOVE

The plan of adoption originated through the supreme love of the Father for His eternal Son.

- The children of God were given by the Father to the Son out of His great love for Him, before the foundation of the world. (Heb 2:13; Is 8:18; John 10:29, John 17:2, John 17:6, John 17:9-12, John 17:24)
- The Father loves the Son because He always does those things which please Him and because He laid down His life for the sheep. (John 10:15,17; John 17:4)
- The Son loves them because the Father gave them to Him. He loved them and gave Himself for them. (Gal 2:20)
- He progressively cleanses and transforms them into His own image. (Eph 5:25; Rev 1:5,6)
- He sees the travail of His soul and is satisfied. (Is 53:11)
- He delights to call them His brethren, reveal the Father to them, sing praises to God in the midst of them and rejoices to proclaim, "Here am I and the children whom God has given me." (Heb 2:12,13)

ACCEPTED IN THE BELOVED

Before the fall, God loved Adam and Eve directly for themselves. They were able to stand before God in their own merits and by their own obedience. That is not our situation in any sense. We stand accepted not in our merits but on the ground of Christ's righteousness alone. We stand accepted in the place that none but Christ could claim.

God's love to us is a special kind of love which does not come to us directly, but through the one mediator between God and man, Jesus Christ (1 Tim 2:5). It comes to us only in virtue of relationship to Jesus Christ (John 17:26).

"No longer far from Him, but now by precious blood made nigh, accepted in the well beloved, near to God's heart we lie."

For the sake of illustration imagine a fairy tale prince of long ago (and a culture which few of us would approve of today):

Suppose the prince falls in love with a woman who is a commoner, marries her and brings her into the royal family. The king has his reservations about the situation, but being a good father-in-law, he fully accepts the new wife for the sake of his son. Suppose also that the woman really loves the prince, and while considering all the wonderful privileges, riches, etc. which she now has, her greatest joy is that it all comes to her through the one she loves.

We Christians have a far greater joy.

Oh, I am my beloved's and my beloved's mine. He brings a poor vile sinner into His house of wine; I stand upon His merit, I know no other stand, not e'en where glory dwelleth in Emanuel's land

The bride eyes not her blessings but her dear bridegroom's face; I will not gaze at glory but on my king of grace, not at the crown He giveth, but on His pierced hand; the Lamb is all the glory of Emanuel's land.

PRACTICAL APPLICATION

We do well to study this great truth of adoption carefully and thoroughly from the Scripture, and meditate upon it so that it goes right down into our hearts bringing forth the response of love, worship, praise and thanksgiving. When we do this, we will find it to have a vital practical effect, for it is one of the great sanctifying truths of the gospel (John 17:17).

In Phil 2:15 we are told that "the children of God" should be harmless and blameless etc. In Eph 5:1 "...be followers of God as dear children."

The following passage gives a list of things the children of God do not do, together with the warning that those who practise such things have no inheritance in the kingdom of God. (Eph 5:2-14). (See also Matt 5:48, Luke 6:36)

In 1 John 3:1-3 it is linked with the coming of Christ and being like Him:

"Beloved, now we are children of God; and it has not yet been revealed what we shall be, but we know that when He is revealed, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is. And everyone who has this hope in him purifies himself, just as He is pure."

Notice that some of the passages which speak of adoption occur in a context of warnings against continuing in sin:

- Just prior to the above passage, there is the warning about being ashamed before Him at His coming and the importance of practising righteousness (1 John 2:28,29). The passage immediately following deals with the same subject (1 John 3:4-15).
- In Rom 8:12-17, a passage concerning adoption, there is both warning and encouragement: "if you live according to the flesh you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live."

How we need to have this great truth of adoption burning strong within our hearts, to bring forth the fruit of love, worship, praise and practical sanctification. Let us rejoice in the authority "that flows from

His throne unto His own."

With such a blessed hope in view, we would more holy be, more like our risen glorious Lord whose face we soon shall see.

- 9. **Rom 8:15-17** For you have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, "Abba, Father." ¹⁶The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with *Him*, that we may also be glorified together.
- 10. **Eph 1:13,14** In whom youalso have *trusted*, after that you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that you believed, you were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise, ¹⁴Which is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory.
- 11. **1 John 3:1** Behold, what manner of love the Father has bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world does not know us, because it did not know him.
- 12. **Rom 8:32** He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?

- 13. **John 3:16** For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life
